University Experiential Learning

Experiential learning at the University of Georgia provides students with hands-on opportunities to connect their academic foundations to the world beyond the classroom, through creative endeavors, study abroad and field schools, internship and leadership opportunities, faculty-mentored research, and service-learning. Effective fall semester 2016, all newly admitted UGA undergraduate students are required to engage in at least one experiential learning activity that enhances learning and positions them for success after graduation.

Areas

Experiential learning "areas" at UGA include CREATIVE, GLOBAL, INTERNSHIP, LEADERSHIP, RESEARCH, and SERVICE. Many courses and non-credit activities encompass multiple areas of experiential learning.

Creative - Students develop an imaginative or original response to a need or inspiration through fine and performing arts or design challenges.

Global (domestic and international) - Students interact with a culture and/or region distinct from their own and engage in academic inquiry and application afforded by the specific off-campus setting.

Internship - Students practice skills or methods related to their fields of study through supervised work in a professional or organizational setting.

Leadership - Students assume a formal or informal leadership role and apply leadership skills to organizational or community objectives.

Research - Students demonstrate and describe how systematic and in-depth inquiry into a problem contributes to the discovery or interpretation of knowledge significant to their fields of study.

Service - Students demonstrate the ability to identify a community need and strategies for addressing it through mutual learning, critical analysis, reflection, and collaboration with a community partner.

The University of Georgia validates all information presented on a student's Experiential Transcript. Validation occurs within each program responsible for the activity, and centrally, with reference to faculty-defined learning outcomes. The Experiential Transcript is an official document of the University of Georgia.

Students are given a choice to select which approved experiential learning activities will display on their Experiential Transcripts.

This transcript includes courses and non-credit activities approved by the University of Georgia Curriculum Committee.

Terms

The term listed on the Experiential Transcript represents the term in which the activity was marked as completed or in progress. Some activities are shorter than a full semester, whereas others may span multiple semesters.

0001 - 0999	Non-credit; Academic Enhancement
1000 - 2999	Undergraduate, Lower Division
3000 - 5999	Undergraduate, Upper Division
6000 - 9999	Graduate

Professional Courses may include course numbers 3000 and above.

A suffix of H denotes Honors Program courses.

A suffix of S denotes service-learning courses.

A suffix of E denotes online courses.

A suffix of W denotes writing intensive courses.
